How to Create a Works Cited Page

What is a Works Cited page?

This is a page that goes at the end of your paper. It lists the sources used in your paper in MLA format.

Here is what a works cited page looks like:

List the MLA of the sources you used in the paper. They are listed by alphabetical order (by the first word of the MLA citation). The sources are not numbered, not bulleted, and not referenced by the source code.

In the center at the top of your page write the words: Works Cited

How do I reverse indent on the computer?

Just type your MLA without worrying about the indents. When finished, highlight the MLA text. Then adjust the margins. The margin bar is at the top of the document. The top shows where a new line will start and the bottom shows where the text wrapped line will start. Move the bottom to the indent marker. Then move the top back to the start marker.
